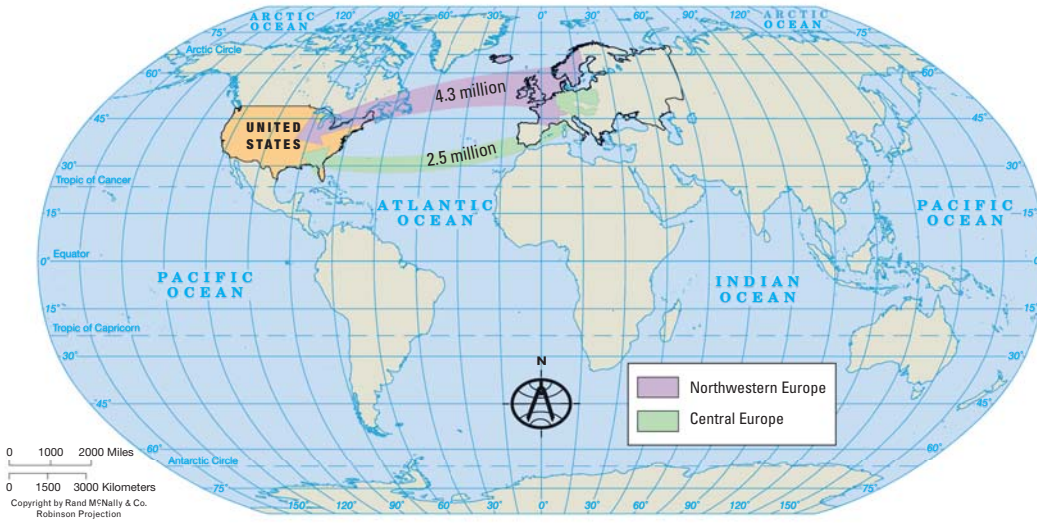




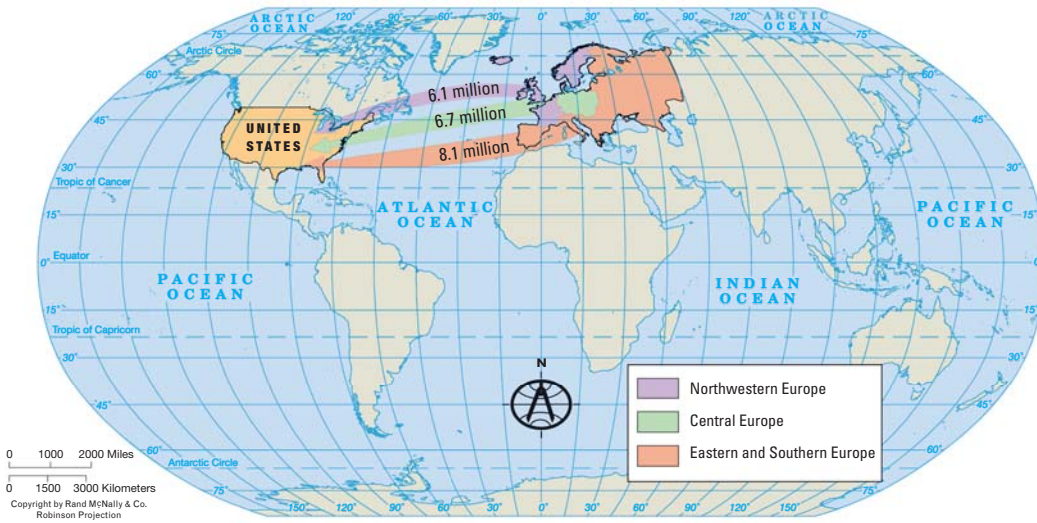




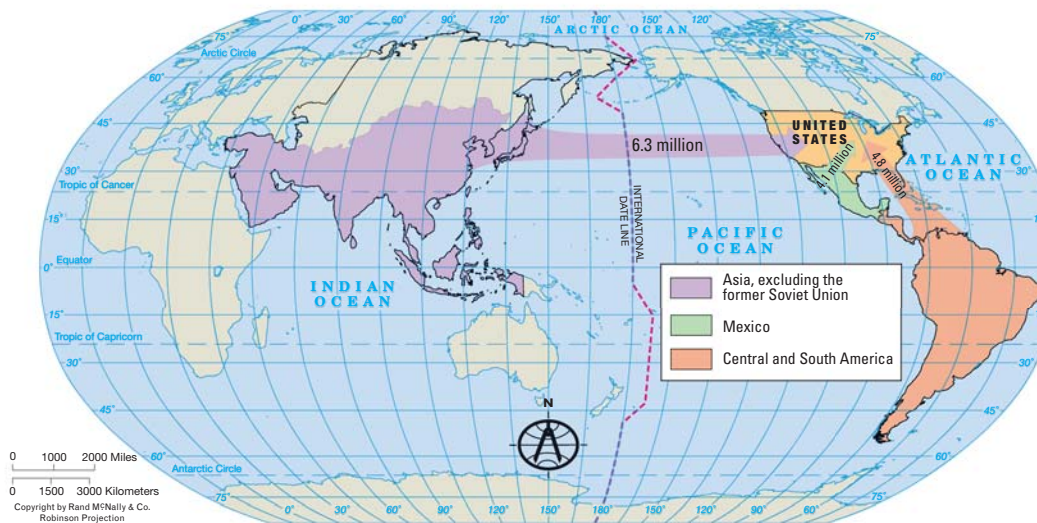




### Immigration 1820–1870

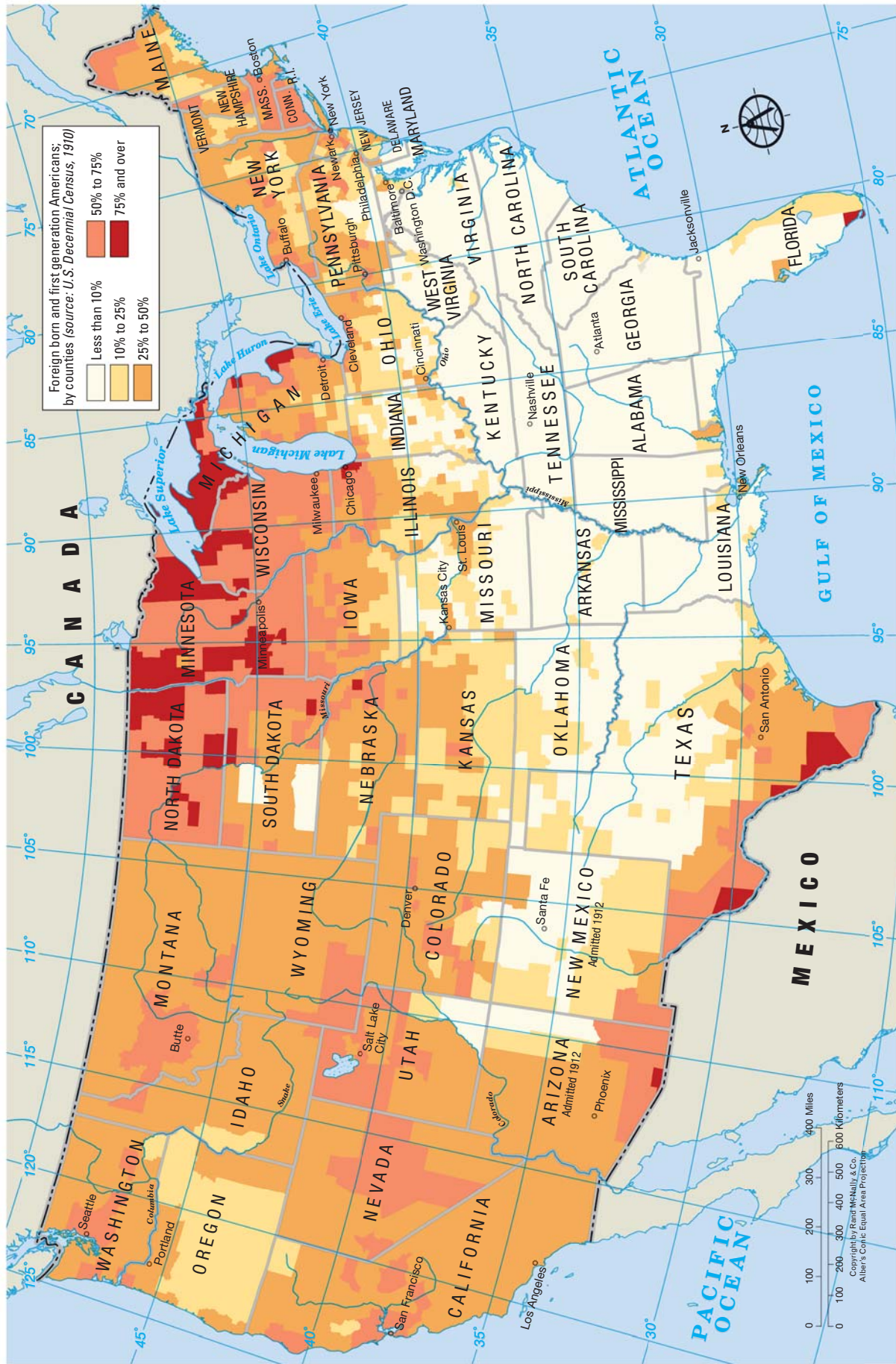

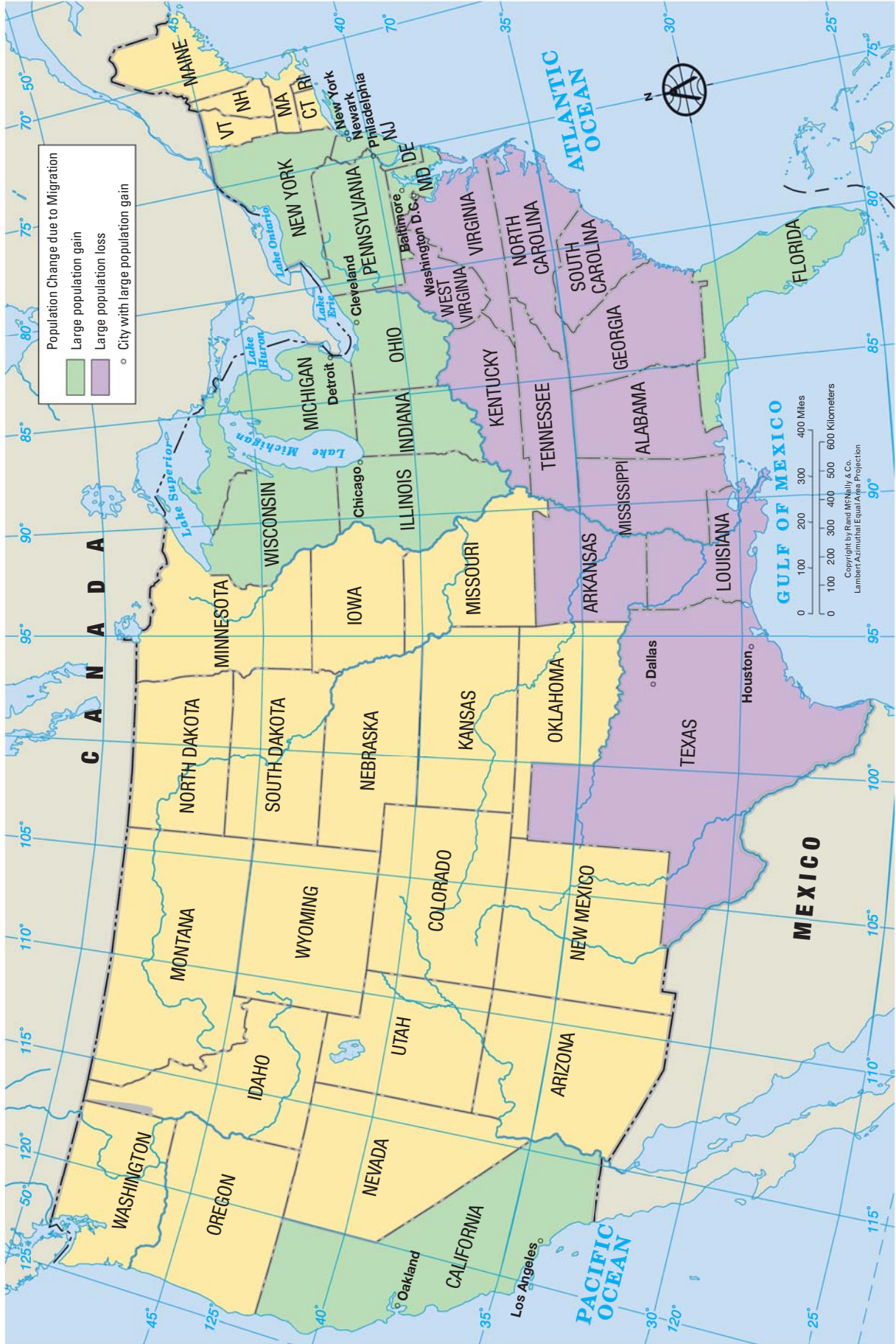

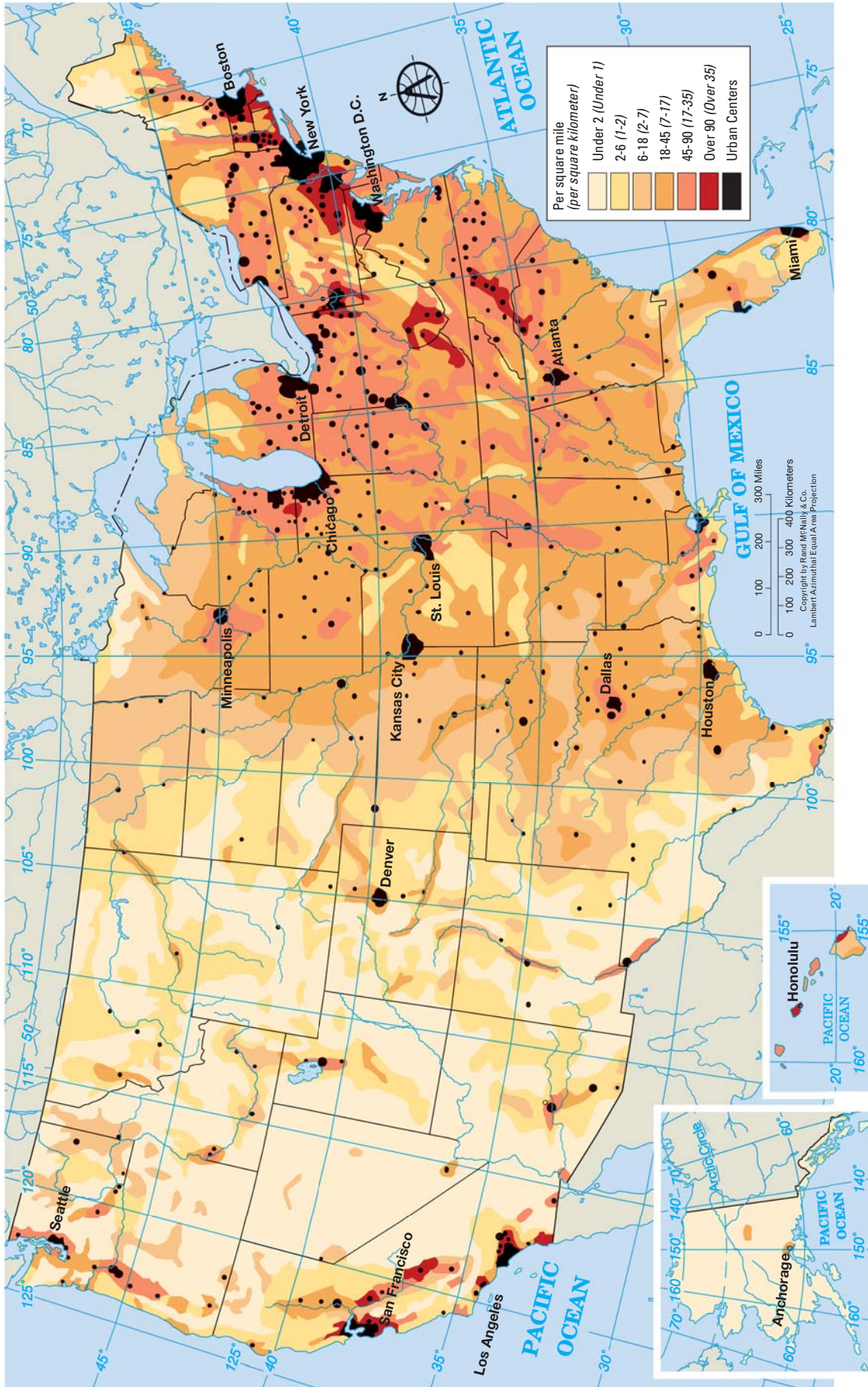
